Latest CMP Electronic Target Monitors Used at Oklahoma Games

At the April CMP Games Matches held at the Oklahoma City Gun Club, the latest improved CMP electronic targets and scoring monitor were used for the first time, replacing the previous monitor system. The CMP has marketed electronic scoring system for several years. It has been demonstrated at Camp Perry and is used at the CMP shooting park at Talladega. A portable 25 target and monitor system will now be transported to the various CMP travel games events.

After many discussions with shooters, future matches with the electronic targets and wireless monitors will return to the familiar paper score cards. The elimination of pit and scoring duty proved to be too big a change for match shooters. The matches will use the electronic monitors but the second rely will provide a scorer for the shooter. Scorers will record hits manually on the conventional score card AND will resolve any

Electronic target scoring eliminates the need to rotate people to the target pits. This speeds up the match.

The portable monitor looking much like a lap top PC is placed on the firing line near the shooter. Previous monitors were hard wired in a "daisy chain" like Christmas tree lights. The system fed the shot information direct to a central computer that recorded the scores. The new system now has smaller lighter wireless monitors. Shooters can move the monitor to suit their position. On the ground to the right or left or on your shooting stool if you prefer. At the 200 yard there is no need for a spotting scope.

The scoring method has changed with the new monitors. A drawback that raised complaints with the previous system was the lack of a way to resolve a shot discrepancy. The human score recorder was replaced with a "Verifier person" and was only to watch safety and confirm shot counts in rapid fire. A crossfire or a unrecorded target hit sent by wire to the master computer was almost impossible to resolve. And the complaints were valid.

The position of the scorer is a bit closer to the shooter. Both people must see the monitor.

discrepancy such as a crossfire or unregistered hit at the time it occurs during firing. This proved to work much better than a fully automated system during the Oklahoma games.

It is an evolving technology and there are always issues with any developing equipment. But all bets point to electronic target systems on more ranges in the future.

Hello From the Legislative Committee Chair Dale Anhalt

This update comes to you on October 13, 2017. Since April we have had two occasions to go to Madison and testify before state committees. First one to the Senate Judiciary and Public Safety committee SB 169 concerning constitutional carry bill. It has been voted out of committee and passed the senate vote. Hopefully we will be looking for an assembly version soon that we can testify for. The other one was for Assembly Committee on Education for bills Assembly Bill 398 - Summer School and Interim Session Classes and Assembly Bill 427 - Comprehensive Firearm Education for High School Pupils the AB 427 has gained wide spread support.

Other bills have had limited advancement we are still working on corrections to the gun free school zones law. With participation gaining for trap shooting and those school sponsored activities. Also, when students go hunting could jeopardize their future with expulsion from school as it is currently written.

The mentor hunting legislation that allows both hunter and mentor to possess a firearm is out of committee. Improvements to range protection is being worked on as well.

Other bills that are designed to erode everyone's 2nd amendment rights have currently not gained support for advancement but we need very much to all remain vigilante as has been recently been demonstrated. The defense and support of the 2nd amendment is of paramount concern for the Wisconsin Firearms Owners but without each of you the supporters we are nothing.
