Sheboygan Rifle and Pistol Club will be hosting the first match of the outdoor pistol season on May 15th at 9am.

It will be an 1800 course with a .22x900 and a Centerfire 900. An 1800 course is a 180 shot match made up of 90 shots with a .22 caliber pistol and 90 shots with any centerfire pistol larger than .32 caliber

This is followed by .22 Excellence in Competition and Service Pistol Excellence in Competition relays.

Excellence in Competition (EIC) matches are a CMP (Civilian Marksmanship Program) program where the winning "*non-distinguished*" competitor can win "*leg points*" towards "*Distinguished Marksmanship*" badges.

(EIC "*leg*" points are awarded to any eligible non-distinguished competitors who places in the top 10% of non-distinguished competitors, provided the score fired by the competitor equals or exceeds the EIC Minimum Credit Score.)

WFO Lobbing Interests

This legislative session, the Wisconsin Firearm Owners (WFO) has been working hard on behalf of our members to track numerous firearm legislation making its way through the state capitol.

Here's a brief synopsis on the bills WFO has both supported and opposed this year.

Support

• **SB-054-**Allow buckshot for the hunting of fur bearing animals.- *Now* **Act 16**

• **AB-193-** Grants to prevent suicide by firearm and making an appropriation

• **AB-293-** Makes Wisconsin a sanctuary state for Second Amendment Rights.- *Vetoed*

• **AB 495-** Possession of a firearm in a vehicle on school grounds by a person with a license to carry a concealed weapon

• **AB 518-** Reciprocity for out-of-state licenses to carry a concealed weapon

• **AB 572-** Limiting civil liability for firearm, firearm accessory, and ammunition manufacturers distributors, importers, trade associations, sellers and dealers.

• **AB 597-** Possession of a firearm by a licensee in a place of worship located on the grounds of a private school

• **SB 611-** Satisfying the hunter education field testing requirement with a mentored hunt

• **SB 619-** Right to carry a weapon in this state.

• **LRB 2985-** Persons convicted of a felony offense that has been expunged and possession of a firearm

The above proposals WFO supports, will likely pass both houses with a majority vote, but, unfortunately, Governor Evers will use his veto power to block each from becoming law. This administration has not been friendly towards second amendment rights and has persistently expressed their agenda against common sense laws that protect both citizens and those who own guns in Wisconsin. The Attorney General's and Democrats recent package shows his opposition to basic second amendment rights.

Oppose

• **SB-656-** Prohibiting firearm accessories that accelerate the rate of fire of a semiautomatic firearm and providing a penalty

• **SB-624-** Background checks requirement before transfers of firearms and providing a penalty

• Attorney General Josh Kaul \$115 million from the state's surplus to be invested in the Safer Wisconsin legislative package. It includes mandatory background checks, a red flag law, and other mandatory provisions.

• Recent Assembly Democrat Firearm Package:

• Storage of firearms in retail facility when unattended

• Storage of a firearm in residence if child is present and providing a penalty

• A requirement to report lost or stolen firearms and providing a penalty.

• Containers or trigger locks provided at a firearm sale and providing a penalty.

• Leaving a firearm in an unlocked vehicle and providing a penalty.

WFO will continue to do all we can to promote the importance of owning a firearm and advocate for laws that protect owners, sportsmen, and citizens in Wisconsin. As statewide campaigns are beginning to ramp up, members should continue to be aware of elected officials who align with our values in the upcoming elections.

Thanks for all your support this year. We continue to work hard for WFO and the second amendment. Look for more updates as the session wraps up this spring and the election gets closer.

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Democratic Gov. Tony Evers vetoed more than 40 Republican authored bills Friday including a package overhauling election administration, while he signed a bipartisan measure that provides funding for the construction of a new juvenile prison in Milwaukee.

The 43 vetoes spanned a wide expanse of bills passed in this election year, measures that Republicans knew were doomed to fail but that give them — and Evers — something to campaign on. Republicans don't have enough votes to override his vetoes.

Biden Administration Announces New Firearm Rule NRI-ILA

On April 11, the Biden Administration announced the finalization of a new firearm rule, and a new nominee to head the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives ("ATF").

The rule, ATF 2021R-05, is substantially the same as when it was proposed last May.

Concealed Carry ?

Instructor's Corner

by Gary Behr Madison This is for informational purposes only and should NOT be construed as *"Instruction"*. That said, here are a few *"tips"*.

Get professional training before attempting any Concealed Carry. It's not enough to just hit a target on the range.

Although Wisconsin Law considers either military training or the DNR's Hunter Safety Course as training criteria, they typically are NOT adequate!

All military are trained in the use of a rifle, only a select few receive training in the use of a sidearm. Likewise, there is no sidearm training in the DNR's Hunter Safety Course either.

Only a dedicated Professional Concealed Carry course can effectively prepare you as to how to effectively anticipate and react to both a critical situations and the inevitable consequences.

If you are thinking of purchasing a sidearm for protection, take a bonafide Concealed Carry course first, *before* you make any purchase.You may find that the knowledge gained can considerably influence your choice of sidearm, save you money and validate your decision. The Federal Government owns 1.87 million acres of land in Wisconsin, and that Federal Laws apply to Federal Lands.

Do NOT draw (present) your firearm unless you are fully prepared to use it. If you display (brandish) your firearm, even if you don't really intend to use it) it could be considered under law, as attempted murder (even if your gun is empty).

Using your firearm should be your absolute last resort. You may have several other options, including escaping.

In any situation that involves dangerous, hostile situation, (i.e. robbery, break in, etc) in which you attempt to protect yourself and/or others, regardless if any shots were fired, can subject yourself to hundreds-of-thousands of dollars in legal defense fees.

There are companies that offer specific protection for such situations. The quality of coverage varies by company and you are encouraged to seek the best coverage suited to your specific needs.

Top Loads At The 2021 USPSA Nationals

Here's a look at the loads that shooters chose at the 2021 USPSA Nationals, listed by gun divisions and based upon the survey data provided by USPSA. <u>Full USPSA Article</u>



The calibers used in the 2021 USPSA Nationals ranged from (I. to r.): .45 ACP, .40 S&W, .38 Super Comp, 9 mm, and in the Revolver division, .38 Spl. and .38 Short Colt.

Overall, the 9 mm was the most popular choice by a noticeable margin.— Chris Christian



The majority of the shooters used handloads, and the bullets available are (left to right): jacketed, plated, coated lead, swaged lead and cast lead.

The latter two were not reported used, but a significant majority of shooters chose coated lead slugs.

- ★ If you're submitting a photo, the larger the file size the better. DON'T bother editing it, we'll take care of that;
- ★ If people can be easily recognized in your photo, be sure to include their name and title or position (i.e. Senator);
- ★ If the photo is taken in public, a "release" shouldn't be necessary. But if the photo was taken in a private setting, legally your safest bet is to get a "release". After all, who can afford a lawsuit?

★ Most important: Include your name, contact information (phone, email) and topic source.

WFO Article Submission: Image and Text "*Releases*"

Some of our readers expressed concern, when considering submission of an article for our newsletter, about Copyright laws pertaining to *"releases"* for names and images.

According to **Stanford Libraries: Copyright and Fair Use**, these guidelines would apply (Reprinted with permission):

When to Use a Release

Whether you need to obtain a release depends on why you want to use a person's name or image. If your use is for commercial purposes—for example, using a person's photo in an advertisement—you need to obtain a release. If your use is for



How To Take Better Pictures

Whether you are using a smart phone or a more conventional camera, these tips are for everyone!

1) When composing an image, use the "*thirds*"

theory, where the most important part of the image is in one of the "*third*" frame sections, but NOT in the middle.

Avoid Important Subject Matter In This Area	

2) Check your

background. Try and avoid

poles or branches growing out of the subject's head, or an unwanted distraction in the back;

3) Always use your flash, even in bright sunlight. It can help fill in some closer shadows and also adds a "*sparkle*" to a person's eyes;

4) Take plenty photos of the same subject. With digital, the cost is negligible and it helps avoid an unwanted blink or glitch;

5) If you have the option, always use the highest quality image (largest size) setting;

6) If you're submitting the image for publication, DO NOT edit it. We'll do that;

7) If you're using images to tell a story, useat least three sets of images:

1). A "long" shot to set the overall scene;

2). A "middle" shot for a descriptive view;

3). A "Close-up" for detail;

informational purposes such as a documentary film or news article, you may not need a release.

Informational Uses

You do not need a release to use a person's name or image for informational purposes. An informational (or "editorial") purpose is anything that informs, educates, or expresses opinions protected under the First Amendment of the United States Constitution freedom of speech and of the press. An informational use would include using a person's name or photograph in a newspaper or magazine article, educational program, film, nonfiction book, or informational website.
